As many of you know, HSSW participates in transports of dogs from across the U.S., or what we like to call "Cuddle Shuttles."

We want to provide you with some insights as to our process and why we do this. Northern states have worked very hard to become no kill and to promote spay and neuter opportunities for pet owners. This has led to a decrease in dogs coming into our shelters, which is amazing and allows us to help our southern states as they still struggle with providing the same access to care. We have multiple Southern shelters and rescues reach out to us weekly pleading to help them with the overabundance of dogs coming in. Some house hundreds of dogs at times, which leads them to arrange transfers with other shelters rather than making hard decisions. This is where HSSW steps in: to make partnerships with these shelters/rescues to help animals that otherwise may be euthanized due to space. Just simple space.

By taking in these animals, we are not only helping Southern shelters, but we are also providing highly adoptable dogs to our community. We do not receive any payment for taking in these animals. To the contrary, we sometimes provide a fee for each animal we take in depending on our partnership and health status of the animal. We fully vet each and every animal, making sure they are healthy, up to date on vaccines and spayed or neutered. Finally, we find them their forever home and provide them with a second chance at a wonderful, loving life that otherwise wouldn't be possible.

From a Life of Shelters to a Loving Home

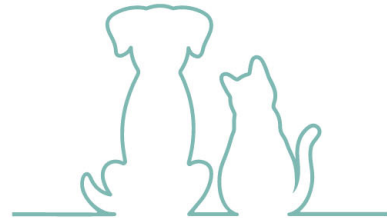

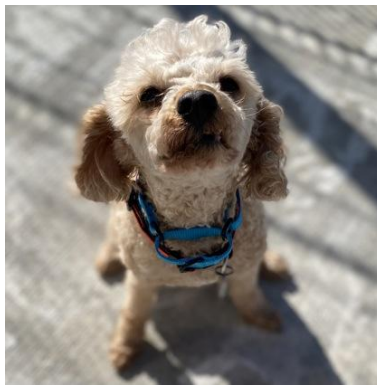
Microchips Help Pets Go Home
