Protect Your Pets from the Summer Heat

The hot summer weather is just beginning and as temperatures increase, there are a few things to consider to keep your pets safe and cool. Remember, if it's hot for you, it's even hotter for your furry friend!

Never leave your pet in a parked car.

The temperature inside your car can increase 20° in just 10 minutes and a cracked window does not keep it cool enough for your pet. Keep your vehicle running with the AC on, or leave your pet at home.

Take your pet to the vet.

A checkup is always a good idea, but especially at the beginning of the hot summer months. This should include a heartworm test and a flea and tick protection plan.

Avoid the heat and bring plenty of water.

Any outdoor exercise should be limited to the cooler parts of the morning and evening. While out and about, a collapsible travel water bowl is a good way to make sure your pet stays hydrated. Hot asphalt can burn the pads of animal's feet. Test the temperature using the back of your hand and if you can't keep it there for 5 seconds, it's too hot for your pup. Try putting booties on their feet or simply stick to the grass.

Signs of overheating in dogs include: heavy panting, dry or pale gums, increased drooling, deep and rapid breathing, and glassy eyes.

Signs of overheating in cats include: restless behavior as they try to find a cool spot, panting, sweaty feet, drooling, excessive grooming, rapid pulse and breathing, redness of the tongue and mouth, vomiting, lethargy, stumbling, and rectal temperature over 105°.
